Virginia supported Leon through the grieving process. Eventually they began to see each other as more than friends, and they have been married for almost eight years.



1,095 guests were assisted with transportation needs and 857 guests were provided with hygiene items

Kid's Kitchen served 2,224 meals and was open 195 days



Kid's Kitchen served 670 unduplicated children

Clothes that work provided apparel to 670 people to help them attain or retain employment



The Free Store gave away 272,701 items of clothing
